BEWARE OF RECENT IRS PHONE SCAM

A New Providence resident informed police that she received a call from an individual claiming to be an IRS investigation officer. The caller told her that she was being investigated for fraudulent tax returns and had to wire funds to Western Union or the authorities would arrest her. Luckily she did not fall for the scam.
