New Providence Police Department Press Release

March 3, 2025

On February 20, 2025 at approximately 12:08 am, Nick Hering, age 31, of New Providence was arrested for possession of a controlled dangerous substance after his vehicle was stopped for motor vehicle violations on South Street. After an investigation was conducted, Mr. Hering was found to be in possession of suspected Xanax. Mr. Hering was processed and released pending a Union County Superior Court date.

On February 20, 2025 at approximately 10:51 am, officers responded to a Borough restaurant on a report of a physical altercation between two employees. After an investigation was completed, officers arrested Chenet Davis, age 38, of New York for simple assault. Ms. Davis was released pending a New Providence Municipal Court date.

On February 20, 2025 at approximately 8:55 pm, Madeyln Ortega, age 57, of North Plainfield was arrested for DWI after her vehicle was stopped for motor vehicle violations on Mountain Avenue. After an investigation was conducted, it was determined that she was under the influence of an intoxicating substance. Ms. Ortega was also found to be in possession of suspected heroin. She was charged with possession of a controlled dangerous substance along with numerous motor vehicle summonses and released to a sober party pending a Union County Superior Court date.

On February 21, 2025 at approximately 8:37 am, officers responded to a residence on Sherwood Drive on a report of a motor vehicle burglary. It was reported that a backpack was stolen from the motor vehicle. Any residents in the Sherwood Drive area who may have seen or captured any suspicious activity on their home security cameras during the early morning hours of February 21st is requested to contact the New Providence Detective Bureau.

On February 24, 2025 at approximately 12:53 pm, a resident of Morehouse Place reported fraudulent transactions to their checking account. It was reported that \$7,000.00 was removed from their checking account between February 14th and February 20th. The fraud is currently under investigation by the New Providence Detective Bureau.
