Residential Armed Robbery Investigation and Arrest

On April 1, 2025, Detectives from the New Providence Police Department charged Kevin Nann, Jr., age 34 of Toms River, after an extensive investigation was conducted into an armed robbery that occurred on October 7, 2024. On that date, officers were dispatched to a residence in the area Princeton Dr. for the report of a robbery. The victim reported hearing glass breaking near the front door and upon checking the door, the victim was confronted by a male standing inside the home, wearing dark clothing and a mask, holding a firearm. The male demanded valuables from the victim which included various pieces of jewelry and currency. The male then fled the scene and left in a dark colored sedan parked in front of the home.

The investigation, led by Det. Michael Carlino and members of the New Providence Police Detective Bureau, developed Mr. Nann as the suspect through various investigative tools. With the assistance of the Union County Sheriff's Office, Union County Prosecutor Office and police agencies in Monmouth and Ocean counties, Detectives ultimately identified Mr. Nann.

“A crime committed against a person inside their home can forever change a person’s sense of security” stated Chief Daniel Henn “Our officers left no stone unturned while investigating this crime. They chased down every lead and used every tool accessible to them in an effort to bring this incident to a close with the arrest of Mr. Nann.”

In consultation with the Union County Prosecutor’s Office, Kevin Nann, Jr. was charged with:

1st degree Armed Robbery
1st degree Unlawful Possession of a Firearm
2nd degree Burglary
2nd degree Possession of a Weapon for an Unlawful Purpose
2nd degree Certain Persons Not to Have Weapons
3rd degree Terroristic Threats
3rd degree Criminal Mischief, and
4th degree Aggravated Assault with a Weapon.

Kevin Nann, Jr. is currently being held at the Ocean County Jail on unrelated charges and will have a court date in the Union County Superior Court.
