New Providence Police Department Press Release

August 4, 2025

On July 18, 2025 at approximately 9:04 pm, a business owner on Kline Boulevard reported being a victim of fraud. The owner reported that they received emails from an individual claiming to be an employee who was requesting their direct deposit bank information be changed. When the actual employee advised the employer that they did not receive their paycheck, it was determined that the request via email was fraudulent. The fraud is currently under investigation by the New Providence Detective Bureau.

On July 22, 2025 at approximately 12:00 pm, a resident of Primrose Drive reported conducting an online search for a tech service to fix their printer and received an unsolicited phone call from an individual claiming to be an employee of a retail store service that works both in-store and on-site. The individual requested credit card numbers which he said he would use to purchase gift cards from the store to pay for the service provided to the customer. Shortly after providing this information, the resident believed this was a scam and canceled the credit cards but found that there were almost \$4,000.00 worth of fraudulent charges to the credit cards. The fraud is currently under investigation by the New Providence Detective Bureau.

On July 24, 2025 at approximately 2:14 am, Nicholas Hering, age 31, of New Providence was arrested for DWI along with possession of a controlled dangerous substance after his vehicle was stopped for motor vehicle violations on South Street. After an investigation was conducted, it was determined that he was under the influence of an intoxicating substance while also in possession of suspected Xanax. Mr. Hering was charged with DWI and released to a sober party pending a mandatory Union County Superior court date.

On July 26, 2025 at approximately 9:08 am, Estefany Sandoval Rodriguez, age 28, of Englewood was arrested for possession of a controlled dangerous substance after her vehicle was stopped on Springfield Avenue for a motor vehicle violation. After an investigation was conducted, the passenger, Jose Ynonan Colan, age 27 of Passaic was also arrested for possession of a controlled dangerous substance. Both were processed and released pending a Union County Superior court date.
